Hero's Harvest: A Community Garden

### Project Description

Character Limit: 2000

Second-Hand Heroes intends to create a community garden at the local Grace Presbyterian Church lot, down the street from our brick-and-mortar shop. This garden would give community members a place to teach, learn, and grow together. Second-Hand Heroes will contribute the amount of food that can be produced on 320 square feet of raised community garden beds in one year to the local food pantry.

The food grown in the garden will be donated to the food pantry. Produce donations to the church will also help create meals for the unhoused, ensuring members of our community who are in need receive healthy food.

This project is essential because the food insecurity rate in Jefferson County is 10%, which directly affects residents and children, causing nutrition deficiencies, health problems, financial strain, and developmental delays.

To begin the project, in the early fall, we would hire a local fencing company to create a fenced-in garden to protect it from animals. We would also use the Fall season to place the garden shed, compost, and trash bins and gather tools and educational supplies.

The food would be grown in ten 4 x 8-foot raised beds. The community garden volunteer teachers will make the raised beds as a learning opportunity in the Fall. This would pass the skill on to the community so that others know how to create raised beds while preparing the garden for planting in the Spring. An irrigation system would need to be installed after the beds are crafted.

The winter would be spent gathering seeds and planning. In late winter, lessons would be planned on planting seed starts in a greenhouse. This is a good life skill to cultivate and an excellent way to utilize the garden in the winter. If it is too cold, the church basement can be a space to meet for these lessons.

Spring is the time to plant and get busy with plants that need to be moved out of the greenhouse. There is a transplanting lesson here. The plants that will start from ground seeds will also be planted now. Green bean poles need to be installed before the beans are planted, offering another lesson opportunity here.

Summer would be for harvesting and measuring the success of the garden. Weighing out the food produced would be an excellent way to track the quantity produced. Lessons would be done in the summertime, covering subjects such as starting seeds in a greenhouse, transplanting starts, creating wildflower seed paper, painting garden rocks, crafting birdhouses, and many more!

Fall is the end of the community garden time frame, and we will evaluate its success and start the process over.

Hero's Harvest would teach gardening lessons for adults and children throughout the year.

The funds will also be used for initial start-up needs such as tools, hoses, seeds, and starts. The educational program will also be funded, including activities, snacks, and water supplies. This fund will also cover ongoing expenses like the water bill and liability insurance. All of this is listed in the detailed budget attached.

Gardening educational lessons will also be held in the community garden, covering subjects such as starting seeds in a greenhouse, transplanting starts, creating wildflower seed paper, painting garden rocks, and crafting birdhouses.

## Expected Impact

The expected impact of the Hero's Harvest project would be to positively impact the food insecurity issue in Jefferson County and foster positive relationships within the community. We intend to explore opportunities to expand the project and determine long-term goals. Fruit trees could be planted, berry bushes could be added, and other food sources could be added.

## Evaluation Strategy

Hero's Harvest would track the amount of food produced from the garden and compare that to the expected Harvest of a 320-cubic-foot garden. Cross-tracking how much food is donated to the food pantry would also show whether the project succeeded in growing food.

We would conduct surveys assessing the educational lessons being taught to get feedback from the community on what they liked and didn't and how to improve for future lessons. We would also track feedback from volunteers and community members through an anonymous drop-off box by the garden gate; this would allow people without internet access to leave their input.
